### **Abdul Rashid Academy of Culinary Arts and Maritime Hospitality (ARACAMH)**

Due to the persistent Covid lockdown, like last year, marketing and subsequent admissions are being carried on digital platforms. Career seminars and counselling sessions are organized on Zoom. For CCMC course, Online Entrance examinations with proctoring mechanism was conducted and interviews were held on Zoom with representatives from LKM school, Nautical and Engineering divisions. 80 students secured admission for CCMC batch no 30. The classes for the new CCMC batch commenced in online mode on 1st June 2021. Mr. Cletus briefed the students about the course and conducted a lecture on netiquettes. One third students from batch no 29 will be arriving in the campus by this month end for practical classes.

BSc Maritime Hospitality Studies and BA Culinary Arts admissions commenced in the month of May 2021. Counselling and interviews are done online. Admission process is expected to gather steam after the HSC results are announced.

Online classes for SY & TY MHS & BACA started from 14th June 2021 on Zoom. CCMC theory classes were held on Teams and Camu software. Daily classes were recorded as per DGS guidelines. Recording of these classes are also being maintained.

Final year BSc Maritime Hospitality Studies students cannot go for Industrial training in hotels like last year. As the Hotels are shut due to lockdown, University has given permission to assign a research project work instead of Industrial Training. Students have been assigned the projects to be completed and a Viva will be conducted as a part of the Final evaluation of Fifth Semester.

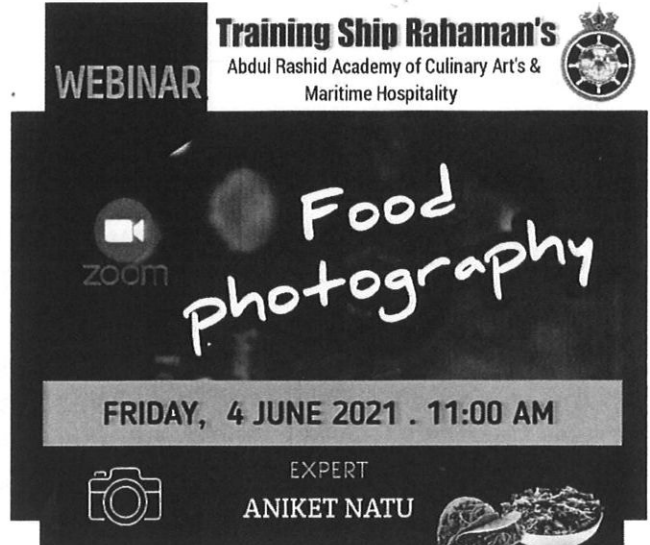
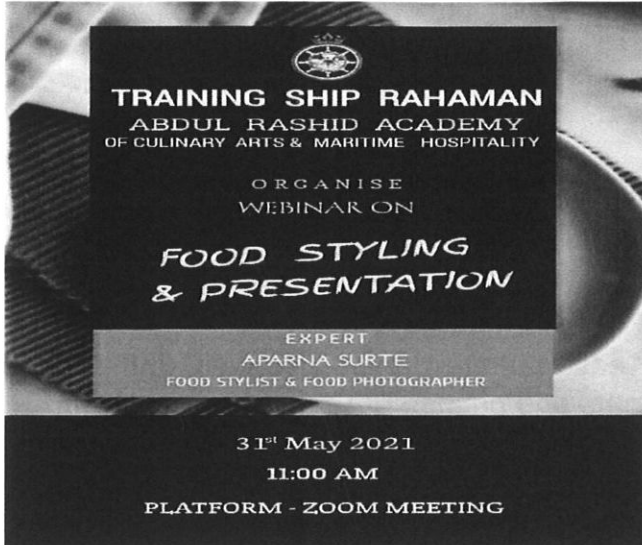
#### **Examinations and Results: -**

75 out of 80 students from CCMC batch no 28 passed the Exit examinations conducted by Board of Examinations for Seafarers.

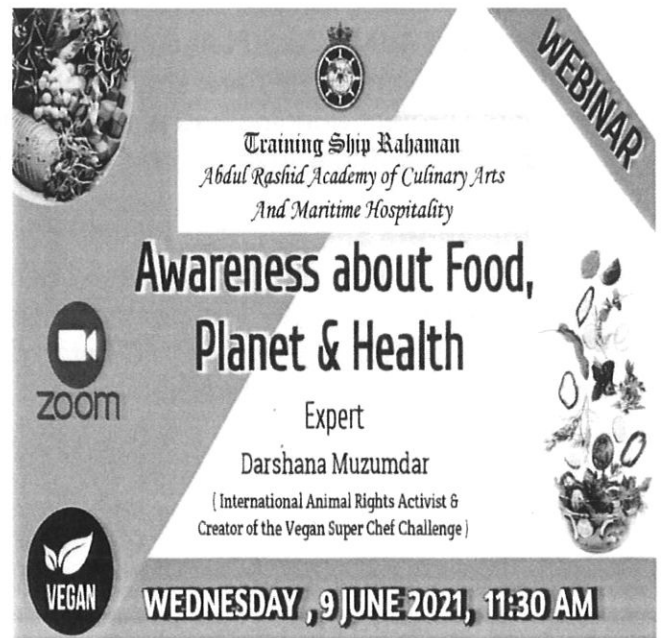
## Webinars & Competitions Online: -

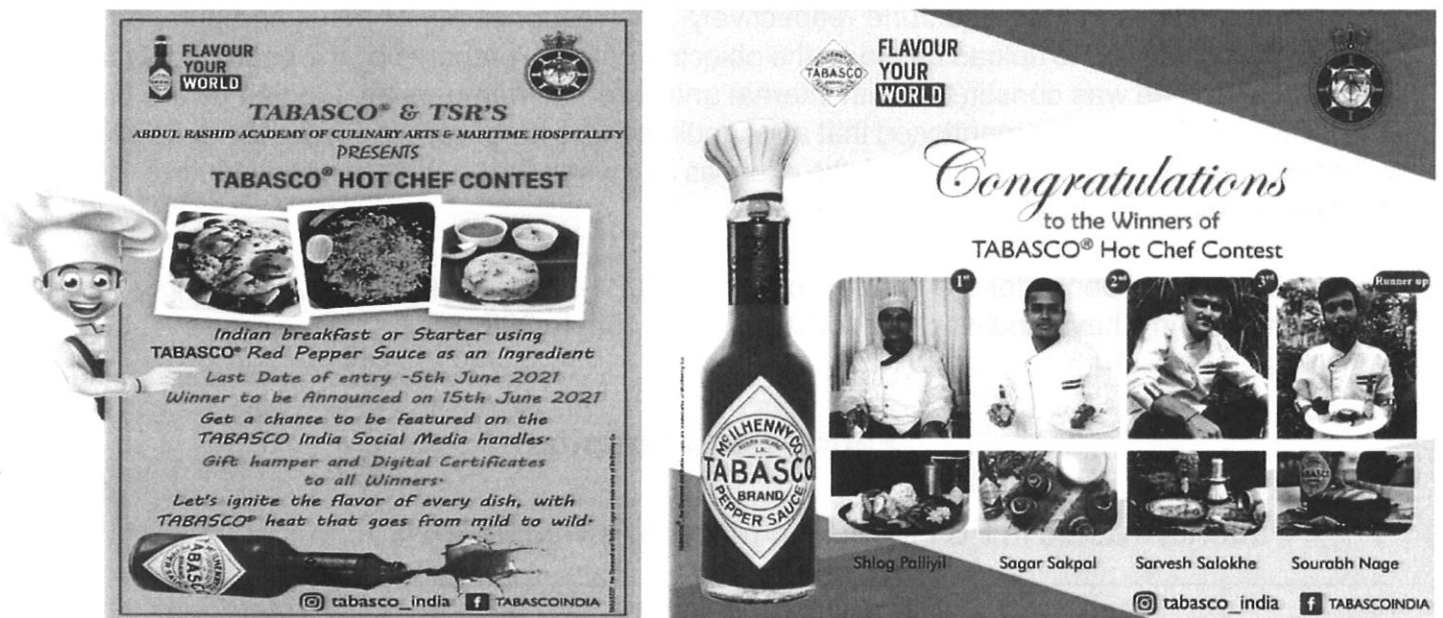

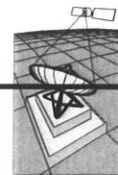

#### ***Infrastructure, Repairs and Maintenance***

Maintenance staffs have completed the roof terrace waterproof repairing of conference room and GMDSS wing of Rahaman College.
