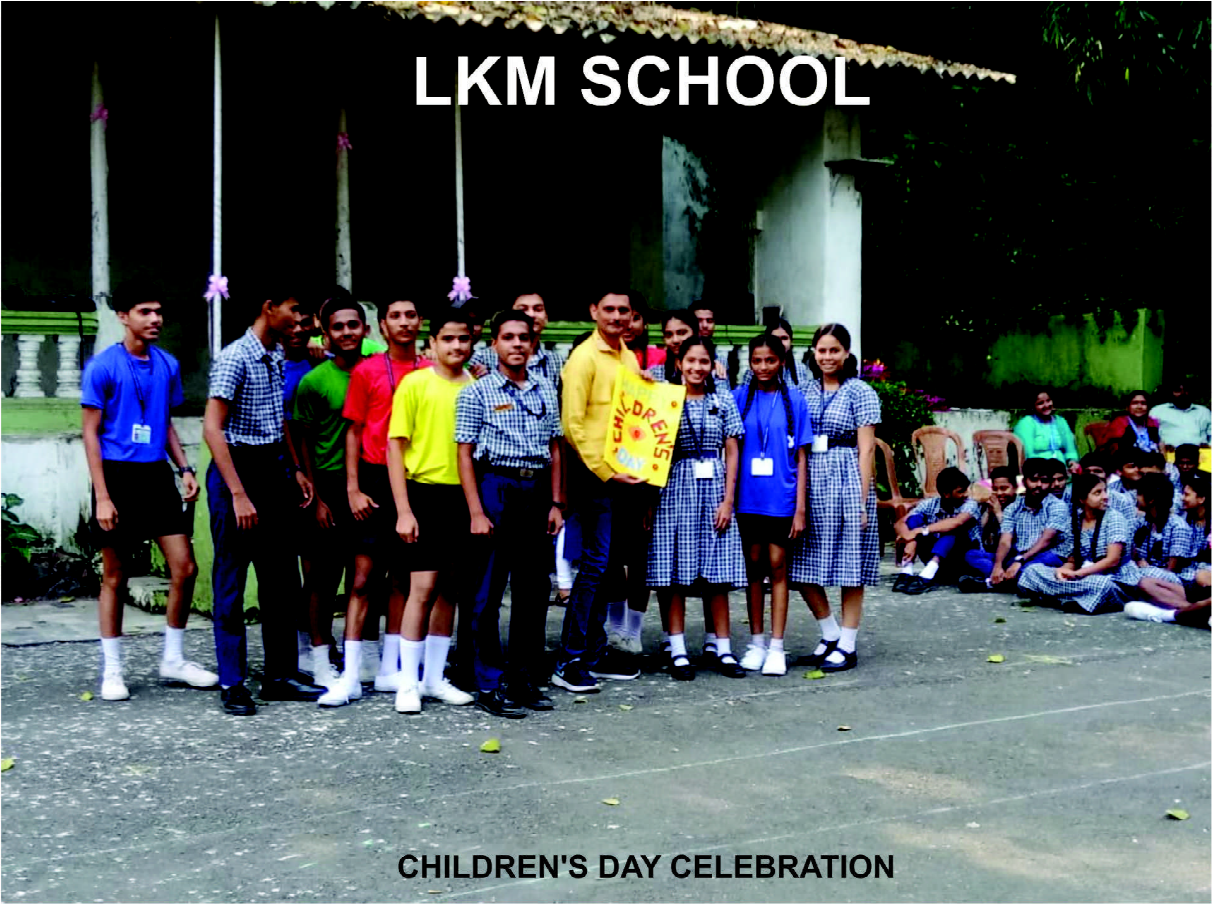

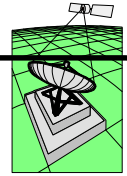

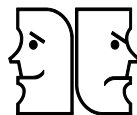
### **George Campbell Library**

## **PRE-SEA CONTRIBUTION TREKKING AT LONAVALA**

On 9th November 2019, the students of GP-II went on a trek to Lonavala. 40 boys packed their bags the previous night, excited to find out what lies ahead. The next morning, we assembled in front of the Hasham Mess and Mr. Rajan Lal briefed us about the trip. We had lunch at noon and boarded the bus on our most awaited journey that began at 1300 hours.

We were so happy and excited for the trip, to be relieved from the hectic schedule. Some listened to music and others played games. We soon reached Khopoli. We were amazed by the beautiful mountains, valleys, and the greenery. We reached Lonavala at 15:50 hrs, the starting point of our adventure. Mr. Andre Morris and his assistants awaited our arrival near the stop. After that, we started walking towards our campsite. We were astounded by the sight of the magnificent mountains and hillside view of natural beauty. The chirping birds kept cheering us on as we walked along the long, narrow path, tired but eager to reach our campsite. The sunset was mesmerizing too before we finally reached at 1800 hrs. We assembled under the tree, exhausted from the long walk. Mr. Andre Morris briefed us about the instructions to be followed during the trek. In the end, we were divided into three groups. Each group had to prepare dinner on the following days. We were allotted our cabins. At 2030 hrs we mustered again for a briefing of night duties. My duty was from midnight to 12:30 a.m.

The next morning at 5:30 hours we got ready and had a cup of tea. We started towards our first activity Rappelling. When we reach the site Mr. Pratap started preparing us for the activity. I wanted to be the first to rappel so I proceeded to the beginning of the line. I was a bit scared and nervous to do it but once I started rappelling, it was easy, a truly enjoyable experience. We got a chance to do it twice. The second time was much easier as I had already learned the techniques to scale down the rock face. On completion, we had breakfast and at 1100 hrs. After everyone had finished their activities, we started moving back to our campsite. We reached the site at 1230 hrs and had lunch. After lunch, we rested for some time and at 1600 hrs we started preparing dinner. The menu was rice, dal, Sheera and brinjal. We had dinner at 1800 hrs and sat in groups chatting with each other. At 2200 hrs we went to sleep

Day 2 began at 0515 hrs with a cup of tea. Then we started towards the same area to do the second activity, Rock climbing. Again I did the task first. I enjoyed doing it for the first time. While we were doing the activity the rest were making breakfast for their respective groups. Then I did the second round of the activity with great enthusiasm. After breakfast, we headed for the next activity 'Jhoomering'. On watching others doing the activity I felt a little apprehensive. I wanted to do it but I was sure it wouldn't be extremely easy. I finally got a chance. As anticipated, I finally completed it with great effort. This was the least enjoyable activity of the three which needed maximum strength and stamina. At around 1250 hrs we started moving towards our site. We reached at 1330 hrs and started preparing lunch. This time we made vegetable pulao, salad and had oranges for dessert. We had lunch at 1530 hrs and rested for a while. At 1730 hrs we started playing games, had dinner at 1900 hours and retired for the night at 2200 hrs.

The third day began at 0515 hrs. We got ready, had tea and started towards Manoranjan Fort at 0600 hrs to view the sunrise. We walked through a narrow road and reached our destination within 15 minutes. The breathtaking view of the hills and the spectacular sunrise was the star of the day. We meditated for sometime after sunrise and enjoyed the cool, pleasant breeze and the picturesque scenery. At 0750 hrs we started back towards our campsite and reached at 0840 hrs.
