Mr. Paul Koshy and Mr. Cletus visited Fleet Management, XT Ship Management and MTM Ship Management on 7<sup>th</sup> Feb 2024 to collect feedback on our students who have joined them and invite them for campus interviews. Mr. Pushkaraj Bhosle and Mr. Kunal Churi from Fleet management conducted campus interviews on 9<sup>th</sup> Feb 2024 and shortlisted 11 candidates for trade tests. Trade tests were held on 10<sup>th</sup> February 2024. They have shortlisted 9 candidates after trade tests.

On 4<sup>th</sup> January 2024 MOL conducted campus interviews for BSc MHS and BA Culinary Arts Students. They have selected 4 of our students. Mr. Ramesh Menon from Marshall Ship Management conducted campus interviews for degree students on 19<sup>th</sup> Jan 2024 and selected 4 candidates.





Parent teachers meeting were held on 17<sup>th</sup> Feb 2024 for parents of BSc Maritime Hospitality Studies and BA Culinary Arts students. 142 parents attended the meet. Mr. Paul Koshy, Dr. Pankaj Deshmukh, Mr. Siraj Shaikh and Dr. Anupam Dhoundiyal addressed the parents. Later the parents met the teachers with their wards to assess their progress.

### Short term courses

Two batches of 5 days training program for Maersk were held on 25<sup>th</sup> Jan 2024 and 29<sup>th</sup> Feb 2024.



We conducted two batches of Refresher course for cooks for Marshall Ship Management from 5<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> Feb and 11<sup>th</sup> to 16<sup>th</sup> March 2024.

We were conducting a Two Months Culinary Skills Enhancement program (CSEP) for Anglo Eastern Ship Management. This was suspended during covid. We have received booking from 15 candidates so for this course and we will be restarting this program from 20<sup>th</sup> May.

A batch of cooks training was held by MCTC Manila from 22<sup>nd</sup> to 27<sup>th</sup> Feb 2024. Mr. Vinod Radhakrishnan visited our campus to conduct the training. MCTC is an organization who conducts catering training for the Shipping Industry. We have been associated with them since 2015.



We had conducted Training for Indian Coast guard in 2012 for their cooks and stewards. Coastguard once had again approached us in 2023 March to enquire about training for their catering staff. The tender was floated by ICG on Government E-market place. We bid for this training along with other Maritime Institutes. We won the bid and subsequently Mr. Cletus Paul and Mr. Soumya Majumdar visited ICG Headquarters for the final negotiations. We completed 5 batches of this training. The last batch passed out on 20<sup>th</sup> Feb 2024. We have received excellent feedback about this training and we have received a query to train 1800 candidates in various disciplines including nautical and safety. We have submitted a budgetary quote for the same.



# LADY KHATUN MARIUM SCHOOL & JUNIOR COLLEGE

- AISSCE Board Practical Examinations for Std. XII was organised from the 15<sup>th</sup> of January to the 1<sup>st</sup> of February, 2024. External Examiners from various schools in Raigad District visited our school as per the CBSE notification. The CBSE-appointed teachers from our school conducted the same in their allotted schools.
- 93 students of Std. X and 56 students of Std. XII appeared for the CBSE Board examinations in February-March, 2024.
- The Annual Examination for the school was held from 1<sup>st</sup> to 13<sup>th</sup> March. Annual results were declared on the 28<sup>th</sup> of March.
- Pre-Primary Sports Day and Annual Day cum Prize distribution day were organised on 19<sup>th</sup> January and 16<sup>th</sup> March respectively.
- The staff and students of the school joined TSR for the 75<sup>th</sup> Republic Day celebration on 26<sup>th</sup> January 2024. The students performed dances and songs on patriotic fervour.
- The school arranged a picnic from the 14<sup>th</sup> to the 16<sup>th</sup> of March, 2024 for the students of Std. V to VIII to Shivganga Water Park Panvel and Std. IX & XI to Parle G Factory and Monterio Resort at Khopoli.
- D-Learners' is a third-party learning software introduced by the school to benefit the weak students through blended learning programs. This program consists of learning elements via visual discrimination and audio discrimination. Using multiple modalities dramatically reinforces engagement, learning, and retention. Initially, the School purchased two licenses, each comprising 15 students, as a pilot project for 1 year. To start with 30 struggling students, mostly from the Primary School have been chosen for this learning program. There are live worksheets after each completed topic, along with graded assessments. The programme has been conducted by the Special Educator, Counsellor, and two Primary School teachers. The school plans to review the progress of these students after 6 months to ascertain whether it should be offered as an additional learning aid to all students at an extra fee.
- A session on Cyber Safety Awareness was organised on 15<sup>th</sup> February 2024 by Mr. Praveen Kharat to educate students about the potential risk associated with internet usage, to promote responsible behaviour and ethical conduct online, to empower students with strategies to protect themselves from cyber threats and to encourage open communication between students, teachers and parents regarding online experiences.

- The Marine Museum, Nhava conducted a workshop for students of Std. VIII and IX in February 2024 to create awareness about National and International Heritage and its importance. A presentation along with a discussion was carried out, followed by a visit to the Marine Museum on our Campus where they participated in teams to solve an activity sheet that gave information about the local and Maritime heritage of the country. Upon completing the sheet they also had to narrate why it was important to preserve our heritage which resulted in some very interesting answers from them.

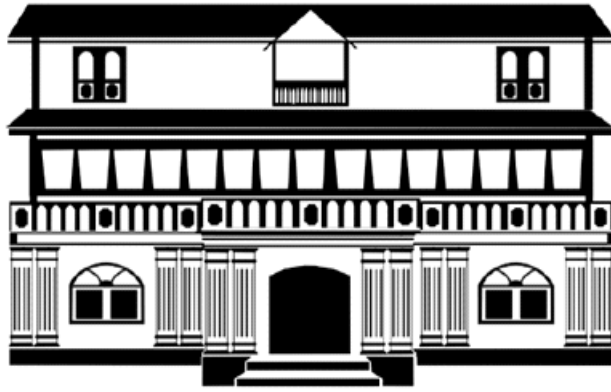
## February 2024

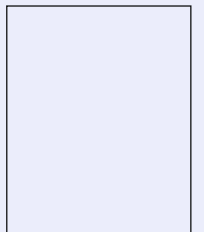
