## ***George Campbell Library***

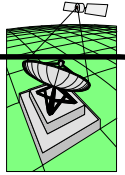

## ***Marine Museum***

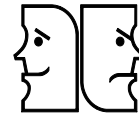
On 17th October, 2019, a group of 83 students from Mahindra School, Malad visited the Marine Museum.
