Maharashtra's Cultural Heritage: Retrospection and Roadmap of Archaeology and Museums DATE: 6TH TO 8TH JULY 2023 DAY 1

The inauguration of the conference was carried out at 11.00 am with the lighting of the lamp by the chief guests. The Welcome address was given by Professor V N Rajashekharan Pillai, Hon. Vice Chancellor of Somaiya Vidyavihar University. It was followed by the address of Sudhir Mungatiwar, Hon Cabinet Minister for forests, cultural affairs

records and the archaeological evidence where experts exchanged their opinions. The day ended with a Pinguli Chitrakathi puppet show which led me to wonder whether the museum could arrange for a similar event in the near future with a theme based on maritime trade.

DAY 2

Day 2 had a lot of interesting sessions where museologists highlighted various aspects of the field. Dr. Tejas Garge (Director of State department of Archaeology and museums) introduced the government museums of Maharashtra and announced the idea of building

a state museum. Ms. Ruta Waghmare (Curator, Bhau Daji Lad museum) emphasized the importance of outreach activities and the understanding of visitors and how to attract them to the museum. Dr Kurush Dalal (Director, INSTUCEN) talked about the idea of developing a culinary museum for Maharashtra, the talk was full of laughter and joy, adding food for thought about the importance of interactive elements in the museum to keep the audience engaged.

Post lunch session revolved around the Representation of Maharashtra's heritage at World Heritage Forum (UNESCO), which focused on Mumbai Art deco buildings and Konkan petroglyphs. Parallel session for Young Scholars was carried out in which the curator presented the paper on 'Marine

Museum, Nhava: the Oldest Maritime Museum of India and its Collection'. The moderator for the session was Dr. Kurush Dalal. The paper will soon be out as part of the e-publication. There was also a session on technology and public archaeology. Day 2 ended with a valedictorian note by Dr A P Jamkhedkar who beautifully summed up the 2 days of conference while highlighting the importance of the heritage of Maharashtra.

DAY 3

Day 3 had different workshops. These included stone tool making, warli art and ancient games. A lecture was conducted by Mr. Tosabanta Padhan, Asst Professor, Nalanda University on the stone tool technology and its development which were followed by demonstrations. 
