20th September 2023

‘Preparing for 2050’ Shipmaning & Training Summit in Mumbai Underscores Collaboration to Achieve Industry Goals of 2050

The 13th & 14th of September saw a very significant section of the global shipmaning & training sector assemble in the city of Mumbai for a look at what the industry needs of the seafarer of 2050.

Turnout that ‘quite a lot’

Following the Indian, the Bharat, tradition of lighting of the ceremonial lamp, signifying the removal of darkness & ignorance, and spreading the lamp’s glow and divine energy – **Tanveer Mehta Jyotirangana** – Capt. Kunal Chaudhary MD of Marex India, welcomed everyone, thanking the guests who had travelled from far and wide to attend this ATP MAREX Global Shipmaning & Training Summit 2023.

The presence of the many industry personalities showed their care for shipping with its constant demands and challenging adaptations.

Vijaya Akash Kumar, Capt. Rajesh Tandon, Deputy Chair of the Board of Advisors, in his brief address, laid the conference topic to be a most pressing and relevant subject of the day as the shipping industry is undergoing significant transformation driven by automation, digitalization, artificial intelligence and green technologies, and it is estimated that approximately 800,000 seafarers worldwide will require new skills. This highlights an opportunity for India to emerge as a leading force in global seafarer supply. India can position itself as a key contributor to the evolving shipping landscape while aligning with the technology changes necessitated by the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

Tandon highlighted that to realize the opportunity, India must promote collaboration among the various stakeholders, including but not limited to government agencies, shipping companies, training institutions, and industry associations. By developing standardized training frameworks, providing lifelong learning, and fostering partnerships, India can establish itself as a global hub for skilled seafarers to meet the industry’s needs of the future.

His Excellency Mr. Yashvir Bhatia, the Ambassador and Consul General of Panama focused on the importance of shipping and highlighted that there were about 40,000 Indian seafarers working on the Panamanian flag. His Excellency was very conscious of the wellbeing of seafarers and their families, especially during the Covid pandemic, and the technological support provided by the flag.

He shared two gold medals, one being awarded to Mr. Anand Arunodoung Delella, the first Indian American as the Secretary General of the International Maritime Organization, and whose main commitment was to put the people and the planet first.

The other gold medal was that the Panama Canal operation was returning back to normalcy after one of the worst periods due to climate change.

The Director General of Shipping, Mr. Shyam Jagannathan, IAS, gave an overview of the Population Prospects 2023, starting with the importance of regulations, especially as to what is acceptable and what is not. He highlighted the role of CO2 Shipping and among others, supporting 250,000 seafarers, and 100,000 other seafarers. He spoke about the Major Port Authorities Act 2021, issued November 2021, Project Pradhan, the five pillars for developing India and education of coastal residents. He also briefly outlined the Maritime India Vision 2030, Marine Industry and Crisis Management Team at the Directorate General of Shipping, comprising of Naval Officer, Chief Surveyor, Additional D.G. Chief Ship Surveyor, Naval Officer (Casualty and Response) and the DDO Chief.

Aggregation emphasized that safety and security of the seafarers is paramount and provided an overview of what would be the requirements for 2050.

Dr. (Mrs.) Malini V. Shankar, IAS (Retd.) / Vice-Chancellor Indian Maritime University, referring to the latest Maritime Annual Review and Forecast report by Drewry, she mentioned that in 2023, the shortfall in the supply of officers has widened to a deficit equivalent to about 6% of the global pool. She mentioned that while this raises the risk of manpower cost inflation, it also presents an opportunity for the youth who aspire to join the maritime workforce.

She mentioned about the Future Skills and Competency needs that include soft skills in leadership and management, and ongoing programmes that encompass the IMO-based education Development of Maritime Autonomous Ships and Systems leads to several requirements. As AI they are complex tasks such as IMO MSA. She then laid emphasis on the quality of faculty and training beyond just class rooms. Fatigue of seafarers, reduced training, short stays in port.

MEC Chairperson, Capt. Bimal Acharya spoke as the Chief Guest of the summit brought out certain pertinent points and his strong personal beliefs. He spoke about Covid and cooperation, focusing on the seafarers made by the seafarers and ‘how the crisis brought the industry together’ India was a shining example on how to bring ALL stakeholders together including the Government of India, CO2 shipping and Ministry of Foreign Affairs in particular to address the crisis and facilitate these changes.

Internationally MEC, IFA and CO2 worked closely to create a joint action body that created sufficient pressure on Governments, IMO, ILO, ICAO, IATA, and others, and challenges to speed movement of seafarers. And this global cooperation has on among IFA, ICAO and MEC to tackle existing challenges in the industry jointly. An MOU has been signed to work on crew training, crew welfare and work on UN and ILO standards. This will be a game changer in facing the challenges in our industry.

Capt. Gaur Belwadia said: Our industry is at a crossroads with technological innovation driving the modern shipping, coupled with Climate Change pressure and UN sustainability goals.

Global Maritime industry is forced to talk about and act on Global warming and transition to a net zero world of shipping.

Whether technology is slowly evolved and adopted, the people who will execute these changes on the seafarers.

He says: Seafarers are the front-line workers on these unprecedented changes in the Maritime industry.

The goal of coming together to support them in training and improving their welfare.

And finally, as he concluding remarks, he very passionately said ‘India is a global leader in inspiring the most competent seafarers. It is important India considers a more active role in shaping the future of seafarers not only for Indian Seafarers, but also for the rest of the world.’

India Leadership in Seafarer training must take the front seat by extending support to countries that are competent trainers.

A paper on the details of this Summit is to be published soon and shared with the Shipping Companies, the Administration, and the industry associations.








College of Maritime Catering & Hospitality Studies Fresher's day





Seminar on Vegan foods





Khel Mela





The curator attended the conference titled 'Maharashtra's Cultural Heritage, Archaeology and Museums: A retrospective and a roadmap ahead' on 6th, 7th & 8th July 2023. The report for the same is attached below.

**Maharashtra's Cultural Heritage:
Retrospection and Roadmap of
Archaeology and Museums
DATE: 6TH TO 8TH JULY 2023**

DAY 1

The inauguration of the conference was carried out at 11.00 am with the lighting of the lamp by the chief guests. The Welcome address was given by Professor V N Rajashekharan Pillai, Hon. Vice Chancellor of Somaiya Vidyavihar University. It was followed by the address of Sudhir Mungatiwar, Hon Cabinet Minister for forests, cultural affairs and fisheries, Govt of Maharashtra who wasn't present but sent his message in writing. The conference was the first of the 75 conferences to be taken up by the government as part of the 75 years of Independence. This was followed by the keynote address by Dr. Sabyasachi Mukherjee (The Director General of CSMVS, Mumbai) who emphasized the need of development of a state museum. Shri Samir Somaiya gave the address leading to the completion of the Inauguration ceremony.

Session 1 Panel

The session of the day was titled 'Archaeology of Maharashtra: An overview and future road.' It traced the recent trends in archaeology while travelling through a time period all the way from Pre History all the way to the Medieval period. The talk on Inscriptions in Maharashtra: An overview by Dr Manjiri Bhalerao featured the Ashokan Edict of Sopara (the replica of the same is depicted at Marine Museum stating that it was the oldest in the state. The coins representing maritime trade were also featured.

The wonderfully informative session was followed by a discussion on the importance of written records and the archaeological evidence where experts exchanged their opinions. The day ended with a Pinguli Chitrakathi puppet show which led me to wonder whether the museum could arrange for a similar event in the near future with a theme based on maritime trade.

DAY 2

Day 2 had a lot of interesting sessions where museologists highlighted various aspects of the field. Dr. Tejas Garge (Director of State department of Archaeology and museums) introduced the government museums of Maharashtra and announced the idea of building a state museum. Ms. Ruta Waghmare (Curator, Bhau Daji Lad museum) emphasized the importance of outreach activities and the understanding of visitors and how to attract them to the museum. Dr Kurush Dalal (Director, INSTUCEN) talked about the idea of developing a culinary museum for Maharashtra, the talk was full of laughter and joy, adding food for thought about the importance of interactive elements in the museum to keep the audience engaged.




