Training Ship Rahaman

Jay....always!

It must have been around the June or July of 2002. Monsoons had set in at Nhava. Lush greenery welcomed a visitor. The Chairman's office was the present Chairperson's office in Samandar Mahal and I, as the Campus Officer – CO, was occupying office directly opposite – the Present Principal, LKM's School's Office. The post of Security Officer had fallen vacant a month or so earlier. You walked in Jay on a rain laden day. Your Papers indicated spotless service in Indian Navy, dealing with Naval Armament and Repairs – risky! Honourably retired with due expertise in security



management, First Aid, fire-fighting and the requisite Indian Naval courses of instruction. What caught my eye was that you were also gualified in unarmed Combat. That could be useful to train our School children and cadets. The Chairman too concurred with my suggestion of engaging you. The Salary was modest as was the case with all employees. You joined us a month later. Thus began an association that would endure for almost two decades. Our common background made it easier to quickly establish working rules. The Foundation's interests came first, always and every time, loyalty was to the Foundation, the Campus and the Security Officer's job was not a 9 to 5 affair; we were always "on duty", we had to be approachable to anyone and everyone, we had to be transparent, honest, no undue advantage of any perks and privileges associated with our Office, and the Foundation's resources were never to be misused. We never looked back thereafter? I soon realised that you had an uncanny ability to network people, you were readily accessible, dealt with crisis with a calm and open mind, an ability to anticipate, being firm with subordinates and frank with colleagues as well as seniors, intolerant for subterfuge and a sustained determination to stay the course till the crisis blew over. You seldom missed anything, you not only observed but 'noticed'! You always accomplished mission whatever it was. Do you remember how you got a Fire tender from ONGC free of cost? You would have succeeded in getting an ambulance as well but for a change of guard at ONGC.

Soon enough a crisis was to test us both. One of the employees, knocked on my door past nine in the night to inform me that his wife was returning to Nhava from Andheri. They had a 7 - 8-year - old son. She had boarded a bus from Panvel to Gavan but no trace thereafter. Such a crisis was also potent with possibilities of kidnap, ransom and other more unsavoury situations as a worst case scenario. We had to visit Panvel and Andheri Police stations that night in our car, monitor telephone calls and further investigate disappearance. It ultimately transpired that the lady had boarded a bus proceeding to Pune and was to alight at Gavan stop but was unwell and thus fell asleep when the bus stopped at Gavan. She ultimately got down at Khadki near Pune in the early hours of the morning. A helpful co-passenger family sheltered her that night. The next day early in the morning we managed to establish contact with her and my wife managed to get her to our home in Pune later in the morning. She was soon united with her family. Jay you struggled for two nights without rest!

When one of the Farm employees committed suicide, you took the heat off us through your

constant liaison with the local police, you prevented attempts at several thefts and encroachments in the Campus by troublesome Nhava Villagers. Do you recall the unsavoury incident in our School that threatened to engulf the Foundation's unsullied reputation? The emotionally charged villagers bent upon storming the Campus, manhandled you and how you managed to tame the irate and unruly crowd that had come prepared to set fire to the Campus property? Your adroit handling of the local Polices, villagers of Nhava, Gram Panchayat, Press, resulted in quickly dousing the fire and bringing the culprit to justice? Do you recall how you managed to prepare a helicopter landing ground at the Jetty when the then Naval Chief of Western Command visited us at short notice? You succeeded in keeping open the access to sea through ONGC for our trainees to visit Mumbai Port and various establishments when everything else failed? Or how you got the MTNL to lay fibre optics cable to our Campus? You ran to the aid of our staff involved in accidents, catching unscrupulous staff who took liberties with the Foundation's property? fire in the Hostel, spotting recalcitrant trainees and staff returning to the Campus with forbidden items, you handled them all with finesse, firmness and compassion! You knew each employee and his or her background.

Yes, I agree, we did not always succeed. Theft in the Barnes Academy of computer parts could not be unravelled but then it was a collective failure, internal systemic fissures and exploitation by unscrupulous staff.

You assisted all those who came seeking your help. Ration cards, gas connections, Passports, Police clearances, Driving Licenses and Police cases? If my office staff went on leave, you successfully handled my office work, Museum Curator absent? You functioned as one, Hostel warden not available? You managed hostels, we gave you major administrative tasks – transport management, Maintenance Department in absence of permanent incumbent. Farm Supervisor missing? You handled the Poultry and Dairy Farm. Exam time and we relied on you to manage the crowd of anxious students and their parents as well as security of question papers and invigilation. Functions on Republic or Independence Days were always a class apart. I can still see you in your Safari suit managing everything with élan and a quiet efficiency.

But if you were absent, we could not get anyone to replace you.

You 'earned' respect, you 'gained' trust, your honesty was 'appreciated' and you 'returned' loyalty.

Yes, Jay we are mere mortals, replaceable and easily forgotten. The Foundation is eternal and it has to survive. It cannot rest on its laurels. You too will be forgotten soon but for those of us for whom you gave your all, you will live on. Old soldiers never die; they just fade away! You will always be there Jay; forever ensconced in our hearts!



Teaching materials have been procured from various books vendors and distributed to all 20 candidates of GME batch- 12 and 119 candidates of GP Rating Batch 72.


There are 749 library users along with 43 outside visitors have been use library facility during this period.
